- Adopt a Highway event 2/26/11.

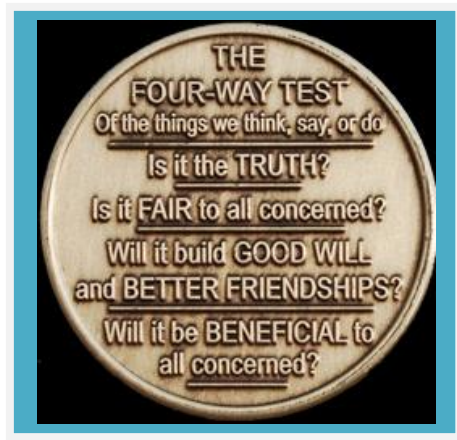
Happy Dollars: The following people were happy because:
