

Max Coppes, MD, PhD, MBA serves in a joint leadership role as Physician-in-Chief for Renown Children's Hospital and the University of Nevada, Reno School of Medicine's Professor and Nell J. Redfield

Chair of Pediatrics. He puts children's health at the forefront through the work of the Child Health Institute and numerous community partners. In his role at Renown Children's Hospital, Dr. Coppes completes the dvad model, which is a national best practice. partnering physician and administrative leadership to strengthen the focus on patients and better coordinate their continuum of care. In an effort to bring additional pediatricians to northern Nevada, Dr. Coppes hopes to implement a pediatric residency at Renown. His strong background attracts subspecialists and helps expand clinical research opportunities in children's health.

Dr. Coppes was President of the British Columbia Cancer Agency in Vancouver, where he was responsible for six regional cancer centers and two cancer research centers.

Meet Fellow Rotarian Dr. Gayle Sherman

Gayle has been a licensed architect for more than 35 years and spent most of her career focusing on retail design and construction. In the mid-1990s, Gayle was hired by LVMH Moet Hennessey Louis Vuitton, а Paris-based conglomerate of more than 60 luxury-goods companies, with the responsibility of acquiring and finishing office space for the company. Gavle was asked to develop and roll-out a chain of cosmetic stores around the world called Sephora. From 1998 to 2010, Gavle served as Senior Vice President of Property Development. In this role, Gayle had the opportunity to work with many talented people on development projects around the world. Gayle's scope of responsibility included global expansion, budget administration, architecture, construction, purchasing, maintenance, site selection, and disaster recovery.

Gayle loved the disaster recovery part of her job and as a result, completed a Doctorate of Business Administration concentrating on emergency management and business continuity planning. In 2010, Gayle established Galena Property Development LLC to work closely with organizations on the development of customized disaster recovery and business continuity management programs.

Gayle is a partner of Hope Community Church in Reno. She has served as a board member and treasurer for the Reno Ski and Recreation Club. She is a member of the Northern Nevada Chamber of Commerce and served as a diplomat for several years.

Gayle and her husband, Peter, like to spend their spare time enjoying outdoor activities. In the winter, they snow ski a few time a week, and in the summer, they enjoy camping trips in their fifth wheel. They have hiked the entire Tahoe Rim Trail, and Gayle rode her bicycle in the AIDS ride from San Francisco to Los Angeles. They met in an elevator in the Parker Meridian Hotel in midtown Manhattan.
