## RENO ROTARY SCULPTURE GARDEN PREVENTS FLOOD

After repeated US Weather Service alerts of a potential flood in downtown Reno the Truckee River stayed well within its banks west of the Arlington Bridge. In an attempt to reconcile the projected flooding in the vicinity of the Arlington Street Bridge the National Weather Service conducted an extensive investigation and

has determined that Rhinoman, the recently installed sculpture in the Reno Rotary Sculpture Garden, actually stared down the raging river keeping it within its banks. The Regional Flood Authority has now indicated that they intend to install additional Rhinoman statutes at key locations along the Truckee River to prevent future flooding. According to John Waterman of the Regional Flood Authority, "this flood control strategy by the Rotary Club of Reno may work wonders controlling the Truckee River during periods of high water."

The Reno Club will soon be recognized by the National Weather Service for its forward thinking in installing Rhinoman in precisely the right location and in a related action, the Mayor and Reno City Council will declare April 1 as "Rhinoman Day" in the City of Reno.
