Thirty-nine years ago Steve Mestre created a landscape maintenance business that is mostly residential. Steve currently serves as owner-manager, with 5 employees and approximately 200 customers, and he notes

that he does not seek to grow the company, saying he likes its current size.

The biggest challenges Steve has are finding good employees, cash flow, government compliance, customer relations, marketing, and finding time for balance in life.

With the ability to preemptively solve problems, Steve says he does pre-planning for the if-then situations that arise, so there is a solution ready to solve each problem. That planning allows for diminished customer service problems. He asks, what if a truck breaks down or what if an employee doesn't show up for work? What if the business computer crashes or what happens if there isn't enough money in the bank to cover payroll? Small business owners, Steve says, need to have the solutions to problems like these before they happen if they want to stay in business.
