MEMBER PROFILE

Karen Grosz



Karen Grosz spent each year in school convinced that she wanted to teach at that grade level when she grew up. To an extent, that did happen, as she taught high school in upstate New York following receipt of her Bachelor's degree from Coe

College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and her Master's degree from the University of Illinois in Champaign/Urbana. When a new community college opened in town, she applied for a secured a job at Monroe Community College. Subsequently, Karen taught English at Santa Monica College for more than twenty years, during which time she served as statewide President of the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges and member and committee vice-chair of the California Community Colleges Board of Governors. Her administrative career included serving as Chief Academic Officer for the Connecticut Community Colleges, and as President and member of the Board of Trustees for the New Hampshire Community Colleges.

Over the years, Karen engaged in community work by serving as President of the Santa Monica League of Women Voters, Member of Leadership Greater Hartford and Board member of a women's shelter in CT. She was a member of the Board of Directors of the Berlin Economic Development Council in NH and member and president of the Board of Directors of Northeastern Rural Health Clinics in Susanville, CA.

Among her major challenges has been dealing with the boss who treats a woman administrator with disdain. One such boss hired Karen Grosz into two full-time jobs consolidated in a cost-saving measure, and then asked her to do extensive research (another full-time position) as well. Her strengths include garnering support and friendship from supervisors and those she supervised. Having worked her way through the ranks to become a college president, she understood faculty challenges and frustrations and thereby earned faculty trust.

Not hesitant to tackle large, complex projects, Karen is logical and enjoys problem-solving.
