USA Cycling Cyclocross Nat'l Championship

Coby Rowe is the host and promoter of USA Cycling's 2018 Cyclocross National Championships coming to Reno in January 2018. An avid cyclist and cyclocross racer, Coby has served as president of one of America's oldest cycling clubs, the Reno Wheelmen, since 2014. Hoping to expand the Wheelmen's reach into the community by growing the club's events and involvement, he proudly serves in this role as the Wheelmen celebrate the organization's Coby's love for the sport of 121st year. cvclocross also led him to become part of the local race series, the Sagebrush Cyclocross series. Taking over the series after the passing of friend and fellow cyclist Erica Greif, he has continued the tradition and reputation of the series for fun, challenging, and family-friendly races. With involvement in events such as CrossVegas UCI World Cup, the UCI Cyclocross World Championships in Louisville Kentucky, the NCNCA District Time Trial Championships and the USGP of Cyclocross, he has vast experience in National and World Cup level cycling events.

In 2015, Coby, along with Shelli Fine of the Reno Sparks Convention and Visitors Authority, bid on and were awarded the 2018 USA Cycling Cyclocross National Championships. The event will take place at Rancho San Rafael Regional Park and is estimated to bring nearly 7,000 people to northern Nevada from January 9-14, 2018. A huge win for Reno, the National Championships will bring people to the community during what is typically a slow time for tourism with a significant economic impact for our region.
