County Manager John Slaughter
State of the County

In October 2013, County Commissioners selected John Slaughter as the Washoe County Manager. John has been with Washoe County since 1986, working as a land use planner, the County's strategic planning manager, and as the Director of Management Services. He represented Washoe County at the Nevada Legislature from 2001-2013 and was named Acting Assistant County Manager prior to his appointment as County Manager.

As Washoe County Manager, John Slaughter serves as liaison between the Board of County Commissioners and elected and appointed department directors, governmental jurisdictions, community and business groups, employees, and county customers. He also oversees the Manager's Office, which facilitates presentation of issues to the Board for their consideration and ensures effective implementation of direction given by the BCC. The Manager's Office also houses the Communications division, Internal Audit division, and Management Services division.

John holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology and Anthropology from Emporia State University, and a Master of Urban Planning degree from the University of Kansas. He has also received the Continuing Education Certificate in Public Management from the University of Nevada, Reno.

MEMBER PROFILE

Dick Gammick

After graduating from high school in 1964 in his hometown of Elko, NV, Dick headed for the University of Nevada in 1964 where he first majored in Civil Engineering and then changed to Accounting. Two years later he and a friend took a bus to Salt Lake City where they enlisted in the United States Army as privates.



During the next 7 years he completed Officers Candidate School in Field Artillery obtaining the rank of 2d Lieutenant; completed flight school where he learned to fly Huey helicopters and did a tour of duty in South Vietnam in 1968-1969 transporting ground troops and flying gunships. After returning to the states, he served as a flight instructor, commanded several military units and finished additional officer training achieving the rank of Captain.

While in flight school, Dick met nurse Norma Wood in Texas which lead to marriage before he went overseas. They started with \$85 between them. 48+ years later they are still together with two grown children; Gina who is a GS-15 civilian with the U.S. Air Force and Rick who drives U.P.S. trucks. They also have 3 grandchildren; Tyler, Tim and Molly.

In 1973 Dick returned to Reno and became a Reno Police Officer working as a patrolman, K-9 handler and Crime Scene Investigator, while still working toward a B.S., which he received in 1977 (yes 13 years later). Dick also met Deputy District Attorney Mills Lane who played a large part in his future.

In 1978, with the help of Mills and Ron Bath, the family moved to Sacramento where Dick joined a medevac unit in the CA National Guard and worked for the Sacramento District

Attorney while attending the McGeorge School of Law during the next four years. Norma went back to nursing and they shared the care of the kids and their home. It was back to Reno after graduation, with a year clerking for Judge Forman.

Dick was hired by Mills as a Washoe County Deputy District Attorney in 1983 and served the next 10 years as a Deputy and Chief Deputy as the head of the Major Violators Unit (Murder Inc.). In 1993 he was hired by the Reno City Attorney as the legal advisor for the Reno Police Department, a position which he held until his election as the Washoe County District Attorney in 1994.

After taking office in 1995, Dick started rebuilding and modernizing the office, bringing it into the 20th century with computerization and started planning on bringing the office back into one building instead of 3 in the downtown area. This was accomplished with the dedication in 2006 of the Mills B. Lane Justice Center. A center dedicated to the investigation of adult and child sexual assault was built on the campus of Northern Nevada Hospital in Sparks. Specialized teams were created within the office. Washoe County Law Enforcement Agencies set the national standard for cooperation and working together to solve and successfully holding perpetrators responsible for their criminal acts. Prior to his retirement in 2015, during his 5th term, the Child Advocacy Center on the Children's Cabinet Campus was dedicated; a single location for the medical and criminal investigation of sexual and child abuse cases.

Since his retirement, he has been continued involvement with the Boys and Girls Club of Truckee Meadows (21+ years board member); Past President and continuing member of Reno Rotary; Board of the Hoff Peace Officer's Memorial; Role Model Summit; Nevada Military Support Alliance and Hot August Nights Advisor.

Dick is very grateful to his family, his home state Nevada, the residents of Washoe County and all of the people who have been there during his career. WHAT A RIDE!!!!!!


