Art Rangel is a certified City Planner with over 35 years of experience in Economic Development, City Planning, and Redevelopment. During his career, Art has prepared various comprehensive Master Plans as well as Redevelopment Implementation plans. As the Director of Community & Economic Development for the City of Downey, California, during the recession of the early 1990's, Art established the city's first business retention, expansion and attraction programs.

Mr. Rangel ended his public-sector career as a City Manager for the Town of Loomis California. Shortly thereafter Art created Rangel Municipal Consulting, specializing in Economic Development, Redevelopment and City Planning. As a consultant, Mr. Rangel continued to prepare Comprehensive Master Plans, Redevelopment Implementation Plans and Economic Development programs for various clients.

As an avid snow skier and cyclist, over the years, Art made many trips to Lake Tahoe and neighboring Reno. For decades Art has felt Northern Nevada had huge Economic Development potential because of Nevada's business friendly environment, proximity to California, transportation ties to the east, and climate.
