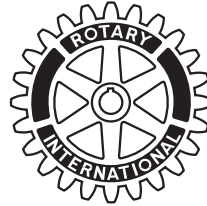
**Organization Plans Made and

# ROTARIANS WILL GO EAST TONIGHT TO CONVENTION

**Judge Willis Brown and B. W.  
Glick Will Be Delegates to  
National Session**

Representative professional and businessmen of Reno, members of Rotary and their guests, assembled at luncheon today in honor of H. J. Brunnier, district Rotary governor, who came here from San Francisco to further the organization of the local unit. Presided over by Judge Willis Brown, president of the Reno Rotary organization, the gathering heard "Rotary" defined. The speakers were Judge Brown, Attorney Ayers, Rev. Brewster Adams and Mr. Brunnier.

Mr. Brunnier congratulated the Reno Rotary Association for the work of organization and predicted that it will grow to be one of the largest and most progressive in his territory. Judge Willis Brown compared the squareness of Rotary, telling of the honesty and spirit portrayed by one of the many little tykes who had been before him for offending against the majesty of the law. He likened the principle of this little youth, who though an offender, was a "sticker and square shooter" to the principle of Rotary.

Rev. Brewster Adams, with a flow of witty oratory, delivered a moral pun. Attorney Ayers predicted added prosperity and co-operation between various interests of Reno because of the formation of a Rotary organization here.

This evening, headed by the Reno band, the Reno Rotarians will accompany Mr. Brunnier to the Rotary special, which will arrive here at 9:05, en route to the national convention at Cincinnati. Judge Willis Brown and Bernard W. Glick will represent Reno at the convention, Mr. Glick leaving on the Rotary special this evening.

# RENO ROTARY CLUB HOLDS ITS FIRST MEETING

The charter members of the Reno Rotary Club, which was recently organized, gathered together for the first time today and spent two hours at a luncheon at the Riverside hotel. Judge Willis Brown, president of the club and delegate from it to the national convention of Rotarians which was held in July in Cincinnati, was the principal speaker at today's meeting and after giving a short account of the convention he told what is meant by Rotary.

"Rotary means that you join together first to serve the community, to serve with your own self and with your business," said Judge Brown. "to dedicate both to the good of others making your community the best and the most ideal in which to live.

"A Rotarian never desires to make mistakes; never plans to be unfair; never cares to talk pessimistic; never delights to talk ill of any person, yet perhaps does all these things occasionally simply because he is not infallible.

"But a Rotarian does believe that he owes himself to his neighbor citizen and to his home town and state—that he has adopted the code of life which means that his business, professional and citizenship acts shall be measured by the rule of what is the best I can do for others, how can I make my vocation of the greatest service to the community, how can I illustrate to others in the same line of effort; to what fairness, courtesy and enterprise I can make my business or profession.

"A Rotarian is fair and honest from the inner conception regardless of societies or legal codes. A Rotarian is basically clean as differentiating from any moral code which may be fixed by common usages only. A Rotarian is willing always to be quoted as the ideal citizen first rather than as a successful business man. Thus we have in the community a group of men who will abandon themselves for the good of all in preference to the personal or selfish good to himself."
