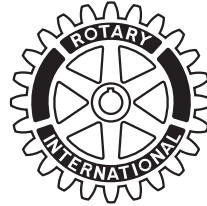

## RENO ROTARIANS TO PICNIC SUNDAY

The Reno Rotary Club's boys' camp at the Country Club above Verdi will be officially opened for the season on Sunday with a picnic in which all members of the club and their families will participate.

Under the direction of B. R. Addenbrooke, the picnic committees have completed arrangements for the affair and it is expected that several hundred men, women and children will take part. Automobiles for those members who have no cars will be provided and several trucks will be used to carry the food to the picnic grounds.

The refreshment committee has informed all members that plenty of food will be available for everyone and it will not be necessary for individuals to bring lunches.

The boys' band of the club will furnish music during the day and various games and athletic events will be arranged for the children.

The road to the club has been put in fine shape for automobile travel and parking space has been provided for several score of cars.

## TO THE ROTARY CLUBS AND ROTARIANS OF THE SECOND DISTRICT

In proposing Charlie Haseman for Governor of the Second District, we have a man with the ability to fill the office with credit to Rotary and distinction to himself.

Charlie is an educator by profession, a public speaker with extraordinary ability, and thoroughly versed in the principles and practices of Rotary. He graduated from Indiana University in 1903, and received his Doctor of Philosophy degree from Goettingen, Germany, in 1907. He taught at his Alma Mater for three years, and is now completing his twenty-first year at the University of Nevada. His travels and educational attainments, coupled with his service to his community, make him well fitted for the office of District Governor.

Charlie has served two years as President of the Nevada Alliance, four years on the Board of Directors of his home club, and one year as its President. He has addressed several Rotary Clubs on Rotary matters. He attended the Convention of Rotary International at Dallas in 1929, and took an active part on the programs at the District Conference at Oakland and the President's and Secretary's Assembly at Santa Barbara in 1930.

Charlie assures us, that if elected, he will so arrange his personal affairs that he will be able to give his entire time to the duties of the office.

Nevada has never proposed a man for the Office of Governor. We feel, therefore, that we are not presuming in proposing one at this time, especially in view of the fact that we have available a man so eminently fitted for this honor.

We respectfully solicit your sincere consideration, therefore, of Charlie Haseman for the Office of Governor for the year 1931-32.
