Chris Hoff is the Tournament Director for the Barracuda Championship –one of only 41 stops on the PGA TOUR in the United States, and the area's only Tier-1 professional

sporting event. Hoff held the position of Tournament Manager from 1997 to 2006 and returned as Tournament Director and head of the Reno-Tahoe Open Foundation. Hoff holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Oregon.
