

Reno Rotary club hits ripe old age of 75 years of service

When you've reached the fine old age of 75, you deserve a little recognition. We refer to the Rotary Club of Reno, which has been one of the original and prominent service clubs in local history.

Reno Rotary was founded in late 1916 by 43 local business and professional men. It was a spinoff of the original Commercial Club, and one of the first goals was seeking Congressional investigation of the railroad freight rates which they said were hindering Reno's progress. It still meets every Monday at Harrah's and now numbers 235.

The first president in 1916 was Miles E. North of New York Life, and the vice-president was Silas E. Ross, mortician. Happy 75th anniversary to this stable and ever-active organization.
