out of bed every morning. On weekends, he can often be found with his best friend and wife Susan cycling somewhere on the Tahoe-Pyramid Bike Trails.

Always happy to roll up his sleeves, David has helped build churches in Mexico, coordinated relief efforts after hurricane Katrina, been a house-parent at a Christian Children's Home for abused/troubled kids and through one of his favorite Rotary projects has helped to provide clean water to villagers in Gondar, Ethiopia.

David challenges himself and those around him to pursue excellence and balance in both life and work. He is a proud past-president of the Reno Central Rotary Club, a wicked competitor at Backgammon and corn-hole and a total marshmallow when it comes to babies, puppies and kids.
