Over the last 30 years, Rotary, the Gates Foundation and Non-Government Organizations have driven that horrible Polio count down to 10 this year, with the only active cases in Pakistan and Afghanistan. But, we still have a way to go, because until we eliminate ALL active polio cases they will exponentially reoccur.
