**Dr. Braimah Apambire and
Dr. Gianluca Bonanno**

*Partnering with Rotary to provide sustainable
safe water, sanitation and hygiene services*

Braimah Apambire is a Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH) and development expert. Braimah is currently a Senior Director of the Center for International Water and Sustainability at the Desert Research Institute, Nevada, where he conducts applied research and provides both technical capacity and information to governmental, private organizations and universities in the WASH sector. He is also an Adjunct Professor at the University of Nevada, Reno, where he has developed an International WASH program, teaching courses with colleagues to WASH and environment professionals in developing countries. He was a senior advisor at the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation and Director of WASH at World Vision. Braimah is a member of the Reno Rotary Club and serves on the International Service Committee. He received his B.S. from the University of Ghana; M.S. from Carleton University, Canada; and his Ph.D. from the University of Nevada, Reno.

With two doctorates in international relations and political science from Ritsumeikan University (Japan) and the School of Oriental and African Studies of the University of London (U.K.), Dr. Gianluca Bonanno, he is a visiting associate professor at Kyoto University (Japan), and a fellow and board member of the Torino World Affairs Institute (Italy). Since 2009 he has worked in the development sector for international governmental and non-governmental organizations. Dr. Bonanno is a Rotary Foundation Fel-

low and since 2011 he has worked with Rotary clubs around the world to implement Global Grant projects in developing countries. Since 2015 he is president and head researcher of the International Peace and Sustainability Organization IPSO with head office in Kyoto, Japan.
