### Monday's Program Dr. Karen Gedney



Karen Gedney MD, ABAARM is board certified in both internal medicine and anti-aging regenerative medicine. As a National Health Service Corps Scholarship winner she was placed in a male medium se-

curity prison after her training to do a four year payback in 1987. Against all odds she turned it into a calling that lasted almost three decades. As a pioneer in HIV care in correctional settings, she was given 'The Nevada Hero's for Humanity Award' in 2000. She was also recognized by the American Correctional Association as one of the 'Best in the Business'. Since leaving the prison in 2016 she has dedicated her life to helping shift the current prison paradigm to one of prevention, healing and re-integration.

### Meet Fellow Rotarian Ryan Hart



Ryan was born in Las Vegas in 1978 and is a 3rd generation Nevadan. His family relocated to Reno shortly after he was born, and Ryan graduated from Wooster High School in 1996 where he played baseball, wrestled, and was on the ski team. After gradua-

tion, Ryan had a cup of coffee at UNR and quickly realized it was too soon to start college. Instead, Ryan worked at IGT for about 4 years and worked his way up from the production line to the electrical engineering department as a buyer for microchips. Purchasing product from a San Diego based company led to a job offer from them in sales and an opportunity to be relocated to the beach. It was an easy choice at the time.

About 5 years after moving there, Ryan got a job selling navigation systems for yachts. His days were spent travelling the West Coast walking onto multimillion-dollar boats consulting on the best solution for their radar and navigation systems. It was a phenomenal job, but one that could only be done on the coast.

In 2003, Ryan re-connected with his past girlfriend Juliana whom he had been with on and off for the previous 5 years. In 2005 they got married and bought a house about 5 miles from the beach. They spent the next 4 years in that house, trying to start a family. After 3 unsuccessful rounds of IVF, they decided it was time to move back to their Reno roots and closer to family.

Ryan immediately got a job in medical device sales and moved back with his wife Juliana. In 2009, Ryan and Juliana found out they were pregnant with twins. Ryan said, "thank goodness because they had leveraged just about

every dollar to their name for this last attempt at starting a family". In 2010 they had their twin girls Mya and Presley. Beautiful, healthy fraternal twins. During this time, Ryan was taking online courses to get his bachelor's degree in business management, which he finally earned in 2011.

After eight years in a very successful medical device sales career, Ryan decided it was time to become his own boss. In 2016, he started an in-home caregiving company in Reno called Amada Senior Care. It grew very quickly to the point that Ryan could barely keep up if he wasn't hiring 20+ people a month. Ryan has built his business to be one of the top 5 franchises in the country out of 135 locations.

After being in business for almost two years, Ryan realized that there was a huge lack of available dollars to help indigent seniors and veterans receive caregiving services they so desperately need. Because of this, Ryan decided to start a non-profit organization called the Hart Foundation which will raise money to provide free caregiving services to veterans and seniors who could not otherwise afford them. The foundation is pending 501c3 status and will be a great resource to our veteran and senior citizen community.

Ryan enjoys golfing, skiing, and any activity on or behind his boat. Most of all, he loves spending any sort of time with his wife and kids.
