J. Kyle Dalpe

TMCC Workforce Development

J. Kyle Dalpe, Ph.D., has gained insight into the changes occurring in Nevada's emerging workforce brought about by Tesla Motors and other new-to-the-region companies through his leadership positions at Truckee Meadows Community College (TMCC) as well his involvement in the state legislative sessions. During the 2017 legislative session, he helped support expanded state funding for career and technical education and assisted with authoring Senate Bill 391, which established the Nevada Promise Scholarship Program for community college students.

Dr. Dalpe has held several executive posts at TMCC since 2002. He is currently serving as the Interim Dean of Technical Sciences, heading the applied tech programs — robotics, advanced manufacturing, welding, machining, HVAC, unmanned aerial systems, diesel and automotive — and initiating industry partnerships including the Panasonic Preferred Pathway (P3) program. He regularly works with major companies to develop training options to meet the needs of the region.

From 2013-2016 he served as Associate Dean, Chief of Staff, and in spring 2016, was appointed Acting President during a transitional period in college administration. Dr. Dalpe also served as the Director of Institutional Advancement and Public Information,

where he helped initiate and implement a \$25 million fundraising campaign to support college initiatives during the recession.

He teaches graduate classes in educational leadership at the University of Nevada, Reno. Organizations in the community have sought him out for training new employees during onboarding, addressing topics such as communications and management of a multi-generational workforce.

Prior to joining TMCC, he served the Director of Marketing and Public Information at Mohave Community College in Kingman, Arizona; Coordinator of University Publications at the University of Texas at Tyler; and an instructor and photographer at Kilgore Junior College, Kilgore, Texas.

Dalpe earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in photojournalism from the University of Connecticut; a Master of Arts Degree in Journalism, Speech, and Political Science from the University of Texas at Tyler; and a Doctor of Philosophy in Educational Leadership from the University of Nevada, Reno.
