Initiative for Teaching Teachers



Like the rest of the nation, northern Nevada faces a critical shortage of qualified science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) teachers and difficulty with recruiting competent, passionate teachers in those subjects com-

pounds the problem. The University of Nevada, Reno is addressing this issue by preparing more STEM educators for our state's middle and high schools through a new program called NevadaTeach. In 2014, the University of Nevada, Reno was selected as one of five universities in the country to receive a \$1.45 million start-up grant from the Howard Hughes Medical Institute to further the expansion of the successful UTeach program pioneered at the University of Texas at Austin. UTeach was designed to put more excellent STEM teachers in classrooms across our nation. NevadaTeach, the University of Nevada, Reno's UTeach based program, was launched in the fall of 2015. It allows students majoring in STEM fields to earn teaching credentials or a second bachelor's degree in secondary education alongside their STEM degree in four years. Dr. Ken Coll was named Dean of the College of Education at the University of Nevada, Reno in 2013. Much of Coll's career and research have fo-

cused on educational psychology and counseling, specialties that overlap with student development at all levels from pre-kindergarten through higher education. Coll spent nearly a decade working as a counselor in higher-education settings early in his career before joining the University of Wyoming where he coordinated the Educational Psychology and Counseling Program and directed the Wyoming Chemical Abuse Resource Center. He next joined South Dakota State University where he served as associate professor of counseling and human resource development. Coll received his doctorate degree in counselor education and supervision from Oregon State University in Corvallis, his masters in counseling from Emporia State University in Kansas and his bachelors in business management from Bloomsburg University in Pennsylvania. He was named the College of Education Researcher of the Year at both Boise State University and the University of Wyoming.


MARDI GRAS VOLUNTEERING
