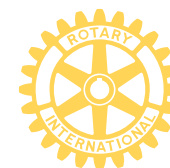

## ROTARY YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARDS (RYLA) – entering Grade 12

High school students spend a week at camp between their junior and senior years in a challenging program of discussions, inspirational addresses, leadership training, and social activities. Designed to enhance character and promote personal development, leadership skills, and good citizenship. Utilizing adventure, personal commitments and shared insights, participants gain an increased sense of confidence in themselves. Attendees have the opportunity to exchange ideas about current issues, and discuss leadership and personal development with knowledgeable local and regional leaders. Attendance is by scholarship only; attendees are selected and funded by their local Rotary Clubs.

### INTERACT – Grades 7 through 12

Interact is Rotary's service club for young people aged 12 to 18. Sponsored by individual Rotary clubs, which provide support and guidance, they are self-governing and self-supporting. Each year, Interact clubs complete at least two community service projects, one of which furthers international understanding and goodwill. Interactors develop a network of friendships with local and overseas clubs. They learn the importance of developing leadership skills and personal integrity, demonstrating helpfulness and respect for others, understanding the value of individual responsibility and hard work, and advancing international understanding and goodwill.

### ROTARY YOUTH EXCHANGE (RYE) – Grade 10 through 12

The world-wide Rotary Youth Exchange Program provides students aged 15 to 18 with an opportunity to live with host families in foreign countries to experience the culture of the host country while serving as ambassadors for their home country. Long term exchange students spend 10 to 12 months living abroad and attending high school. The short term program is a 6 to 8 week family to family program in which two students in two countries are paired with each other and host each other for 3 to 4 weeks.

Inbound students come from many countries to stay with host families here.

Outbound students (local students) travel to many countries to stay with host families.
