Servant Leadership



Have you ever wondered what makes a good leader? Have you had a boss that focused on managing you rather than leading? What kind of a leader do those around you think you are? Importantly, what can you do to become a better leader?

All good questions and most will be answered in the presentation on Rotary Leadership, a program that uses servant leadership as a deep resource. The training program was conceived and implemented in a pilot project in North America in 2021 by Rotarians Dr. Kent Keith of Honolulu Sunrise, an international expert on servant leadership, and Jerry Hall of the Reno Rotary Club. Districts in Seattle and Denver have implemented the training program and District 5190 trained facilitators and completed the first in person training October 12-13 – a day and half of intensive training at the Atlantis Hotel. The program will train, equip, and support community health workers to conduct assessments and treatments, strengthening the health system's ability to respond to malaria cases and prevent transmission. The Rotary Foundation, World Vision U.S., and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation each gave \$2 million for this effort, for total funding of \$6 million.
