Amanda Hilton is a fourth-generation Nevada native who grew up in Reno and Ely, graduating from White Pine High School. She is President of the Nevada Mining Association (NVMA) and began her role in January

2024. Prior to her current position, Hilton served as the first female general manager of the KGHM Robinson Mine for over six years, one of Nevada's largest and oldest operating mines. She was a member of the NVMA Board of Directors during that time and served as the organization's first and only female Chair in 2021-2022. Before her appointment as General Manager, she filled various roles at the Robinson Mine in Ely, where she had worked since 2004.

Hilton earned her B.S. in Accounting from the University of Utah and her M.B.A. from the University of Wisconsin. She is also a Certified Public Accountant. In recent years, she was featured in the "Pioneering the Field: Women in Mining" exhibit at the National Mining Hall of Fame and Museum in Leadville, Colorado, and in 2025 was named a Woman to Watch by Nevada Business Magazine. She was also recognized by her peers in 2020, winning the prestigious General Manager



Safety Award. She and her husband have two young children and love enjoying Nevada's many outdoor recreational activities.


