They have also been responsible for running the Suisun City Kroc Center—a Salvation Army community center with an indoor pool, full-size gym, wellness center, arts center, day camp and classes for people of all ages—and saw its programs through the COVID-19 pandemic. When stay-at-home orders were first issued, the Majors Hartt opened an emergency pop-up childcare facility for the children of first responders, healthcare professionals and other essential workers




