While Committee members may identify potential projects by attending a Rotary Project Fair, it has become more common in recent years that our projects stem from 2 sources. First, we consider joining in projects and support to other clubs, individuals, and organizations many if not most, we have worked with before. Secondly, we create our own projects where we see the need and solicit other Clubs to support us.

Our funding comes from many places including: Reno Rotary Foundation (RRF), where our current annual budget is \$50,000, gifts from Reno Rotary members and members of other Clubs, District Designated Funds and Rotary International matching Funds and finally, for-profit as well as not-for-profits gifts and grants.

We are currently managing 8 projects from areas as diverse as Uganda, Romania, Thailand, and Haiti and will be spotlighting them for today's presentation.

There are currently have 12 active members in our Committee and we welcome any Rotarian who would like to know more about our Committee or is interested in getting involved. No experience necessary!

Rotary started with the vision of one man — Paul Harris. The Chicago attorney formed the Rotary Club of Chicago on 23 February 1905, so professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas, form meaningful, lifelong friendships, and give back to their communities.
