*Intro to Sierra Nevada Journeys and
Nonprofit Program Evaluation Best Practices*

Sierra Nevada Journeys has been recognized for their robust program evaluation frameworks, and the team will share their journey in developing and improving program evaluation processes at Sierra Nevada Journeys by sharing several areas of their own evaluation evolution. Sean and Eaton have presented to several national conferences on the importance of Program Evaluation and best practices for mid-sized education nonprofits.

Since 2012, Eaton Dunkelberger has led Sierra Nevada Journeys, an outdoor science education nonprofit based in Reno and serving communities from across northern California and Nevada. Since 2012, Sierra Nevada Journeys has quadrupled the number of students served annually, and in 2021 they serve 24,000 students with 72% from low income families. Eaton recently accepted a role as the CEO of the Community Foundation of Northern Nevada, and will
