## Monday's Program Ed Lawson, Mayor of Sparks City Expansion



Ed Lawson has gone from growing up in Las Vegas, to playing college football at Colorado State, to becoming the 26th Mayor of Sparks.

Lawson said one of his highest priorities

as mayor is getting a road built between USA Parkway and the industrial center in Storey County and La Posada in Spanish Springs.

He said about 40,000 people will be living in that area north of Interstate 80 over the next couple of years.

He said the plan is to be a partner with Storey County, not a competitor, and that the city of Sparks has identified about 40,000 acres east of the city for industrial and residential use.

"We'll do 100-acre or smaller parcels, so if you're the widget maker for Panasonic you can live here in Washoe County and pay Washoe County taxes, so we get a little bit of the benefit of that business" he said, smiling.

He said taking back the Truckee River is also a big priority and that it has been neglected for too long.

He said homelessness is also a huge problem, but that it is complicated and will take a multi-faceted approach to help.

Lawson was elected to the Sparks City Council in November 2010, re-elected in 2014 and 2018 and was appointed Mayor Pro Tempore in November of 2018.

He moved to Sparks in 1989, after playing on the offensive line for the football team at Colorado State.

Lawson serves on the Regional Planning Governing Board, the Reno-Sparks Convention and Visitors Authority board of directors, the community homelessness advisory board and several other boards and commissions. He is an active member in the Rotary Club of Sparks and has been recognized as the 2014 Public Official of the Year by the Builders Association of Northern Nevada.
