

(b) have served as club president for a full term or as charter president for at least six months;

(c) demonstrate willingness, commitment, and ability to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of a governor in section 16.030.;

(d) demonstrate knowledge of the qualifications, duties, and responsibilities of governor as prescribed in the bylaws; and

(e) submit to RI a statement that the Rotarian understands those qualifications, duties, and responsibilities, is qualified for the office of governor, and is willing and able to assume and faithfully perform those duties and responsibilities.

the Reno City Council, to serve the remainder of Mayor Hillary Schieve's vacated term. He was elected to a four-year term in 2016.

As a result of his leadership on the City Council, Reno was the first city in Nevada to join the C40 Compact of Mayors, convened the city's Climate Action Initiative Group to build climate change resiliency and reduce the city's carbon emissions, and launched "ReEnergize Reno," an ambitious program to improve building efficiency 20% by 2025. As part of the program, Reno became the first city in Nevada to adopt an energy benchmarking ordinance, promoting transparency in building energy use to increase efficiency.


Prior to his service on the Reno City Council, Mr. Bobzien served four terms as an Assemblyman representing District 24 in the Nevada Legislature. During his legislative career, he worked on a wide variety of issues, most notably on conservation and clean energy policy including net metering, renewable incentives programs, energy efficiency, and the renewable portfolio standard. During the 2013 session, Mr. Bobzien chaired the Assembly Commerce and Labor committee and shepherded landmark legislation retiring Nevada-serving coal-fired power plants.

His first professional job was at Lynch Communications in Reno. They designed and manufactured common carrier equipment for the independent (non-Bell) telephone companies. Common Carrier was an industry term for bad-ass modems between telephone company Central Offices (CO).

He then started Lockwood Moore, Inc with Ray Lockwood in 1975. They initially sold typewriters and electronic calculators. They gradually moved up to Word Processing Systems, then PCs, copiers, computer networks, and now we provide complete integration of security cameras, copiersprinters, servers and all things IT to meet today's Network Security demands.
