engaging personality helped her win an At-Large Reno City Council seat on November 6, 2012. In these divisive political times, Hill holds proudly to her independent nonpartisan political status.

Now, on her third term as Mayor, Hill has invigorated a downtown that attracts residents, students, businesses and visitors. As a major supporter of arts and culture, she was named Elected Arts Advocate of the Year in 2019 by the Americans For The Arts. In June of 2023, Hill was named President of the U.S. Conference of Mayors–only the 8th woman to be elected to that position in the organization's 81-year history.

Interesting fact: Hill grew up figure skating and competed nationally in pursuit of an Olympic dream, but was stricken with kidney failure. As fate would have it, her sister saved Hillary's life by donating her kidney for a transplant. Today, Hill is a strong advocate for organ donation and mental health and lobbies nationwide on these vital health issues.
