Identifying Youth and Family Addiction



David Atherton was raised in Zephyr Cove, NV. In high school he excelled at football, played junior college football, then received a partial scholarship to a division II school. He started working in the mental health field with kids ages 5-12 and then

worked off and on for the next 17 years with kids, mainly in residential treatment facilities, and then 5 years for the state of Nevada with mentally ill inmates.

He said at one point, he was addicted to pain pills and heroin for 6 years, and an alcoholic for 13 years and has been clean for 10 years now. He recently started his own business working with individuals suffering from substance abuse issues post-rehab.

Bwindi Hospital ICU Global Grants Update

The first ship from NYC with the fixed x-ray and Carestream CR system, 4 new Ventilators, and donated equipment from NYC/ CT and Catholic Medical Missions Board pharma supplies is currently scheduled to dock in Mombasa on 8/30/22.

The second ship from Project CURE/ Philadelphia is now scheduled to dock in Mombasa on 9/1/22 with the new PACs computer and monitors and all the donated equipment/supplies from Denver.

Assuming everything is there by mid September, they will have 6 weeks to install the x rays, set up the ICUs and prepare for Herman Oosterwijk, our computer/ imaging expert from Texas, visit in early November. He will set up all the computer imaging systems and the tele-medicine network.

Hopefully this will be one more good chapter in the Rotary Partnership and growth of BCH and increase their capacity to deliver health care to the underserved population of SW Uganda.
