Former Rotarian Sheila Hlubucek is speaking to us September 16 about Drift Farm, which is her flower farming and designing enterprise. Most of you know her from her 40 years of working in marketing and public relations. Her career included Q&D Construction, Clark & Sullivan and Renown.

But Sheila now has a new communication medium: Flowers. You know, when you just don't have the words? You give flowers.

Growing and designing with fresh flowers was Sheila's side hustle for nearly a decade. But turning 60 in a COVID nation inspired her to commit 100% to making the world a prettier place. So she became a flower farmer designer.

The deadlines and stress are behind her. Most days feature hard work and fresh air - what she knew as a kid growing up on a farm in Montana. She calls her enterprise Drift Farm, because like Mae West once said, "I used to be Snow White but I drifted."

Sheila's goal is to get all the good people she knows addicted to garden fresh flowers. She sells seasonal subscriptions, occasional bouquets and event flowers. She also offers bouquet tour events.
