About Bob Cashell:

Robert Cashell Sr. was known to thousands of residents as "Mayor Bob" during his three consecutive terms as City of Reno Mayor, 2002-2014. He also served as lieutenant governor for the State of Nevada, as regent for the Nevada System of Higher Education, and built a humble truck stop in Verdi into the Boomtown Hotel Casino. He passed away from natural causes on Feb. 11, 2020, at the age of 81.

After his passing, the Reno Gazette-Journal wrote about Bob, "The three-term mayor brought a knack for bridging intractable divides — either through cajoling, the force

of his larger-than-life, personality or political shrewdness — to usher in a period of tremendous growth for the city."

About the Garden:

The Bob Cashell Memorial Garden is fully funded by the members of the Rotary Club of Reno, the "downtown club." Mayor Cashell joined the club in 2008. The club's Community Services Committee steered the development of the memorial garden. The Rotary Club is committed to maintaining this garden, as well as the Reno Rotary Sculpture Garden in Bicentennial Park, and the Riverside Drive Gardens
