MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Stephanie Fisher from the Nevada County District Attorney's Office presented on the establishment of the

Family Justice Center (FJC) in Nevada County. The FJC aims to provide a comprehensive network of trauma-informed services for crime survivors in a single, safe location. This initiative will reduce redundancy among service



providers and enhance support for victims.

The FJC is currently forming partnerships and plans to host a strategic planning session in September 2025 to gather insights from stakeholders, partners, and survivors. The information collected will help develop a website, informational materials, and additional partnerships. The goal is to have the FJC operational by March 2026.

Ed Silverster was honored with honorary Emeritus Status for his decades of exemplary service to Rotary and the community. With over 40 years of dedication, he notably established a Disc Golf



course at Condon Park in Grass Valley, which is still actively used today and recognized as the 13th best disc golf destination in CA.






