enough, they also provide healthy snacks for 2178 kids in school programs. Consider there are only 40,000 households in Nevada County. 7.5% are receiving help from the Food Bank.

So from where does the fresh produce come? Some from right here in our County through the Garden Program. The farms are found behind Green and Gold and the Penn Valley Community Center. With the help of Caseywood, Rare Earth, Green and Gold, Empire Fence and 20 other local merchants; more than 50 4

x 8 foot planters were built, planted, and irrigated. More are being built in Penn Valley. Over a ton of fresh produce is harvested each year.

And, finally, we learned about the progress of the Penn Valley Community Center. Their permits are all falling into place



and with that, the funding. They hope to break ground in March 2016. The site will house a library, performing arts center, and other office space.
