Our first community service project is in the books and a success. We provided vaccinations to 55 students and dental exams to another 25. 22 Rotarians helped, 1/3 of our club – a great turnout.

Our District Gov visited Monday and gave your board high marks for their organization and planning. She was impressed with our Fellowship planning and involvement with our Area 4 clubs.

GREAT NEWS ---Africa's last polio case occurred in Somalia on August 11 last year. Nigeria reached one year without a reported case on July 24. The World Health Organization (WHO) may soon remove Nigeria from the list of polio endemic countries. When Africa goes three years without a case of polio, WHO will certify the region as polio-free. We are "this close" to eradicating another deadly virus from the planet
