- Visit by District Governor The District Governor will be at our August 8th meeting. He will first meet with club leadership, then attend our meeting. All club members



"red flag" to the thieves because they know there is mail inside the box.

Alex also said that the IRS scam violation notices are also common locally. The notices give a phone number to call, then they scam the victims and intimidate them in to paying money for supposed back taxes that are owed. Another scam is late night calls from people claiming to be "jailers" or "police" asking for bail money for a loved one. Alex advised to insist on getting the name of the institution, then calling to confirm before agreeing to send any money. There are also Craigslist scams where there are either false sales or rentals and panhandler scams. Victims of these kinds of frauds should file a fraud report with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC).

Alex closed his talk by reminding the club that he has duck race tickets in case anyone wanted to purchase them.
