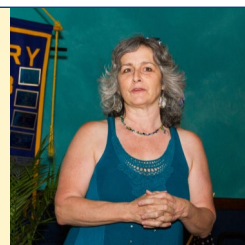
This provides opportunities for local merchants to engage in social media and connect with local residents and visitors. Both city councils and chambers of commerce are very active and interested in helping people make progress. Over 2500 people attended the youth festival in Pioneer Park last week.

They’re currently working on a plan to seek community input – via over 800 surveys – asking why people are here, and identify the impact of arts on communities. They’re also working on a monthly newsletter for the community. To include the homeless population, they’re starting the “Belonging” art program, and Nevada City may restructure Commercial Street to make it more welcoming. Their website - [www.nevadacountyarts.org](http://www.nevadacountyarts.org) – has a calendar which they’re working to coordinate with NC and GV Chamber calendars, so all events are easily accessible.
