Their topic was protecting essential lands in the Sierra Nevada foothills and mountains, and connecting people to nature.

They're currently working to preserve and protect over 15,000 acres in three counties via 29 conservation easements, 10 nature preserves, over 30 miles of hiking trails, and working with PG&E.

Current projects include:

Lindsey Lakes Preserve – the upper Yuba headwaters Smiling Owl Preserve – the north fork of Deer Creek

Hidden Springs Ranch – 2,300 acres of Yuba County rangeland the borders Beale AFB

They work to restore and manage areas via:

Pollinator gardens, Regenerative rangeland management, Forest management

<u>Building trails:</u> in GV working to expand Wolf Creek trail; and have receive a \$312,000 grant to expand trails in the Rice's Crossing preserve project.

Their Encounter Nature project is to get kids and schools into "living classrooms" via:

Bio-Blitz – to have them document living plants, animals, etc at

JR Conservationists - to engage in nature story-telling They work to connect with the community via partnership – committee members, volunteers, agencies, stewardship council, hosting treks, fireside chats, special events and via the State Parks.
