Now will 5 full-time and 4 part-time staff members the Foundation exists to raise funds for the hospital and provide community service. 100% of donations got to the hospital and stay in our community – annual average about 1 million per year. Then, she updated on the various areas of work:

<u>Because of You</u> – an Alzheimer's outreach project to provide counseling, crisis intervention, caregiver education, respite care, and training for first responders and doctors.

<u>Comfort Cuisine</u> – Started by Ann Wilder to provide special, free meals to those in need, via the cancer center

<u>Savvy Women Talk</u> – started last year, to present talks on specific topics for women – bringing friendship, social engagement, and helpful info to our community. The next presentation – by travel expert Michelle Bates – will be 9/29 from 5:15 to 6:30 at Center for the Arts

<u>Grateful Family Program</u> – patients and their families are invited, and encouraged, to send along their story to honor caregivers, doctors, nurses, and any hospital staff who provided help to them.

<u>Volunteering</u> – Events like Starry Starry Nights, Martinis and a Movie, the annual golf tournament, along with peer-to-peer fundraising, office support, or participating in the Hospital Auxiliary.

<u>Foundation Service Awards</u> – are presented annually to those who give time and effort. You're encouraged to send along suggestions for humanitarian servers in our community

<u>Grants</u> – The Foundation recently received a major portion of a telemedicine collaboration grant of \$280,000, awarded by USDA to several Dignity hospitals.

Since 2002 the GV Rotary has donated almost \$7,000 to the Foundation. Kris Stepanian drew the white marble – claiming neither the \$50 nor The
