WSMC steadily aims at providing quality medical coverage to all of the residents of Nevada, Sierra, Placer, and Yuba counties regardless of their ability to pay. WSMC factors in the potential patients willingness to pay and then proceeds with the most fitting course of action.

WSMC has 5 permanent locations: Downieville, Grass Valley, Auburn, Penn Valley, and Kings Beach. These locations are best posi-

tioned to cover the medical needs of people living in frontier, rural, and also urban areas. Furthermore, over 75% of it's patients are "low-income". Even though WSMC makes people's health a top priority, they have been able to save MEDI-CAL over 12 million dollars.
