It has been a tense week for many in Nevada County. On the afternoon of August 4, a fire broke out near the Bear River Campground, not far from Dog Bar Rd and Magnolia Rd. Over the course of the next few hours, the fire, known as the **River Fire**, grew in size and intensity and put the new ZONE system to the test. Neighborhoods were put on mandatory evacuation while others were put on a warning to evacuate. The entire community was on pins and needles, not knowing which way the wind would blow.

At the time of this writing, CAL FIRE has reported the River Fire has destroyed 88 structures and injured 3 persons. It is holding at
