
The Nevada County Fairgrounds, also known as the 17th District Agricultural Association, was established in 1884. It came to fruition by legislative action in 1859, which authorized the formation of agricultural districts. The first Nevada County Fair was held in 1938 at Veterans Memorial Building, and has been around since that date. No County Fair was held in 1942 through 1946 due to World War II. The first Nevada County Fair at its current location on McCourtney Road was held in 1947. The first buildings on the grounds were built in 1951.

The Nevada County Fairgrounds is an economic, social, and cultural treasure for Nevada County. In 2015, approximately 270,000 people attended events at the Nevada County Fairgrounds, which created a total spending impact of approximately \$28 million on the local economy and created approximately 240 jobs.

Planning for this year's fair is well underway!

A tentative theme for the 2023 fair has been chosen: County Roots and Cowboy Boots.

The Nevada County Fair directors discussed the lineup for the main event in the stadium which can hold up to 5,000 visitors. A concert planned for Wednesday night; Friday through Sunday will have motor sports; however, ideas are being researched for the Thursday night event. Country Artist Tyler Rich will kick off the fair on August 9th. The community looks forward to these event's each year and the Nevada County Fairgrounds is proud to be an integral element in the growth in our city!
