However, after he located a lost gold vein and made the mine richest one in California, they lived an abundant life. They traveled via private planes, raced thoroughbred horses, and wore expensive jewels. Errol also socialized with San Francisco's glamorous and eccentric "Big Alma" Spreckels. Then World War II shut down their

Santa Rosa winery, closed America's gold mines, and halted work on his incredible state-of-the-art hospital in Grass Valley. When MacBoyle suffered a paralytic stroke, no one imagined he could salvage his broken empire, but they were wrong. His accomplishments echo in our community, and will most likely do so throughout history.
