

Speaker: Jan Blake, Executive Director for Nevada County Resource Conservation District

The organization started after 1930's Dust Bowl. 17 families over 150 years still ranching/farming in Nevada County. "Working Lands" is a documentary about these families, shown on PBS and available on DVD at their office. www.ncrcd.org is the website. Jan let us know that there are few places to go for help with dealing with Bark Beetle. Start with PG&E, which will take the tree(s) down and remove wood if tree is dead and endangering the power grid. CFIP, a program through Cal Fire – see their website to apply. USDA Natural Resources has a cost-sharing program. Those are about it. There is no place to take downed lumber anymore. Mills are all gone. Remaining places (Sierra Pacific Industries in Lincoln) is overwhelmed and not accepting wood. Ponderosa pine has been hit the hardest over the longest period of time. Now affecting Spruce, Redwood, and Cedar. Once tree is turning orange, beetle has done its damage and probably even moved on to a neighboring tree. Drought affecting trees ability to combat the pest. Our trees/forests/properties are too dense. New Leaf is a new company that will chip up trees, but you have to get the wood to them. Their office has Bluebird boxes, Wren, Woodduck, Owl, etc for sale. They are at 113 Presley Way off Main Street.
