

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Lisa Jarvis and Dan Frisella, fellow Rotarians of the 49er Club, gave us a presentation on NevCo CEO. CEO stands for Creating Entrepreneurial Opportunities.



The new program's main purpose is to teach students skills to start new businesses. It is a cohort entrepreneur program for High School Juniors and Seniors, and the credits will be transferable to Sierra College.

NevCo CEO is working to raise funds to pay for the \$35,000 needed for the initial curriculum purchase, and are halfway there. It is the first program of this kind in California and donations are very much needed to help fund the initial criterium purchase.

Our guest speaker was Homer Nottingham, a Holistic QiGong Master. His organization is Tai Chi Qigong for Health. He has been teaching Tai Chi for 25 years at Pioneer Park and the South Yuba Club.



His #1 goal is brain fitness. His #2 goal is strength training, and his #3 goal is flexibility. He reminded us how important it is to breathe through your nose as much as possible as 25% more oxygen gets to your brain than breathing through your mouth. Neck exercises are very important for the flow of blood to the brain. His organization is trying to start a Blue Zone at the in the vicinity of WSMC.

During this week's Member Spotlight, Ed Pinto gave us an overview of his time working for Inmar in North Carolina. Inmar is a company that is a reverse distributor, which means that they also coordinate the return of expired medications from hospitals to pharmacies for
