President Sean called his last regular meeting to order with his Rotary Bell. Patti greeted members and guests, Rod led us in the Pledge, and Pat gave the Thought for the Day.

Our speaker was Jamie Hanf, Health Education Coordinator for Nevada County Public Health. She specifically spoke to dentistry and youth oral health programs. Poor oral health in the youth of Nevada County (and elsewhere) is the leading cause of absenteeism, low self esteem, trouble with speaking



and participating, and trouble connecting. She works to help find Dentists that would be a good fit in providing oral health programs as early as possible in the education system. Funding for the oral health programs, screening, cleaning, and providing dental work as needed comes from Prop 56. It's marked for the purpose of education, prevention and treating dental disease.


