Topic: Fire Safety

Bob outlined the risks and potential impact of fires in our community and how we as a community and individually can prepare for a potential wild fire. He said "Ready, Set, Go" is the mantra, and there are websites and a 20-page brochure to get more information about fire safety and preparedness:

- 2. AreYouFireSafe.com

Bob outlined steps to take to be fire wise:

- Create defensible space around your home--100 ft from all structures
- Harden Home: screens with 1/8 inch screening over all air vents and put screens around raised decks
- 3. Make a Wild Fire Action Plan:
- Create a Go Bag a.
- Sign up for CodeRed (once signed up, the alert

- Shut off gas main
- d. Know evacuation routes
- e. Create a Family Communication Plan
- Compile a list of phone numbers and pertinent websites, including radio stations, YubaNet, The Union etc.
- Call 211 NOT 911 for fire information!
- Don't haul RVs or trailers, since they could block road access and take up needed space for other drivers trying to evacuate.
- DON'T WAIT TO LEAVE AFTER RED FLAG NOTIFICA-TION. "Leaving early can be the difference between life and death".
- Establish accountability and communication with neighj. bors. Use a buddy system of 4-6 neighbors who will commit to alerting each other in the event of fire or evacuation.
- Keep auto gas tanks over 1/2 full at all times during fire seak. son.
- Be sure you have 10ft clearance on either side of your driveway to allow access and room for emergency vehicles access and turn-around space.

Personal preparedness is a must! Get information, obtain more knowledge about how to prepare your home and your family for a potential wild fire, and take action.
