Along with housing, they provide counseling and guidance. The kids sometimes have experienced unsafe prior conditions, and here at the Center, they have the opportunity to enroll in school as well.

The Salvation Army assists families in locating permanent homes in conjunction with Cal Works. The Center has a full kitchen, laundry area, and family area. Each family has its own food storage, and a scheduled time to cook and eat. Sarah thanked the Rotary Club of Grass Valley for the recent donation of a new washer and dryer, and said that it made a major positive impact in the lives of the residents.
