Trisha grew up in Nevada County, she is a Civil Engineer and has worked for the county for three years. NCPW has eight divisions: Administration, County Surveyor, Engineering, Fleet, Road Maintenance, Solid Waste, Transit Services, and Wastewater. Tisha focused on Vegetation and Road Maintenance management, which encompasses 560 miles of county roads and attempts to create 10 feet of clearance on each side of the roadway. The program budget is \$900,000 for 20-21 and is funded by the gas tax. The focus of road maintenance is to keep the actual roads safe and secondarily on fire control. The vegetation maintenance budget is 15% of the overall budget.

NCPW works in collaboration with the Fire Safe Council and continues to apply for grants to cover their projected shortfall. NCPW recently received a \$868,084 grant from CalFire for vegetation maintenance work on over 2000 miles of County roads (work to start by fall of 2020). NCPW also has another \$200,000 in grants in process.

NCPW focuses on roads by fire zone populations, in order to prioritize projects. All road projects will be released to residents when the schedule is finalized. NCPW also works with residents to create vegetation clearance via encroachment permits, which are required for work, and resident can apply online at mynevadacounty.com.
