Program: Lexie Alford, the youngest person to visit every country....soon!

Lexie is 21 years old and born and raised in Nevada City. She is working to achieve the Guinness Book of World Records for being the youngest person to travel to every sovereign nation. She is giving her first TEDEx talk in Austria this summer. By the time she was 18 she had traveled to 70 countries. Lexie has al-



ways been passionate about traveling. There are 196 sovereign nations around the world. Her talked focused on getting out of your comfort zone and how traveling addresses the various fears of stepping out of your

There is the physical comfort zone and the natural fear of death and getting hurt. She only felt in physical danger one time in Yemen. Turned out to just be a wedding party shooting guns to celebrate. Sometimes fear is just a misunderstanding of cultures.

There is the mental comfort zone. We are creatures of routine and travel gets you out of your routine comfort zone. Lexie spent seven months alone in the last two years including a few days on a small island with no outside connections. She faced the fear of being alone and learned how to be alone without being lonely. Strangers are friends you haven't had the chance to meet yet.

Lexie only has one country left to break the record which is North Korea. This is a very difficult country to visit because of the current travel ban. She has worked with Guinness Book of World Records and the governments to be able to visit a small part of a de-militarized zone of North Korea and is going on May 31st.
