**Monty East** outlined a few noteworthy things being done by our club's donation committee. To mention just a few: fundraising for the Food Bank, Salvation Army, 4-H, High School Grad Nights, SNMH Foundation, etc. Monty also stated that \$3500 has already been raised in sponsorships for our Gold Country Challenge with more money projected in the future.

Our speaker today was **Dr. Brian Evans**, MD, President and CEO of Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital. His presentation was very interesting and informative since our local hospital is very important to all of us who live and work in Nevada County. Some of the highlights of his presentation were:



- Since 1958 when its doors opened SNMH has been owned by the people of Nevada County.
- The hospital has a budget of \$100 Million with 800 employees who provide wide ranging services to nearly 100,000 community residents, many of whom are seniors
- The biggest projects at the present time are a modern Diagnostic Imaging Center and a refurbished Emergency Room
- SNMH is classified as a Rural Hospital. With about 100
  Rural Hospitals closing each month due in part to Medicare and older populations, SNMH's operating budget is not at a level where it should be and management is taking steps to address the budgetary issue. Without fundraising efforts, community support and affinity relations, the future of SNMH could be in jeopardy.
