Program – today's presenter was President Bob. He started off with highlights he's submitted for the District Conference:

- We exceeded our Foundation giving goal by \$400
  - We've given more than \$6,000 to local organizations
  - Our community support events – Shots for Tots; Dental Clinic; Repairing the SMMC dental van
  - We need about \$500 to reach our Polio Plus goal of \$2,000
- Then, he updated us on the Gold Country Challenge:
- 136 riders registered so far – last year there were 146, but 50 of them registered in the last 2 weeks, so he projects that we'll exceed last year's participation
